



Forgive this critic for seasoning a humbug on his palate, but the holidays have returned, and with them, the traditional platters of over-spiced, under-executed mush on every plate. As I always profess, discover what you do well and stick to it. Don't get cute. Don't do specialty. So, upon learning that the Carthay Circle Restaurant would be offering a "unique" holiday menu, the red pen of sardonicism eagerly raised its indulgent head.

Entering the grand dining establishment, I must admit I was charmed by the seasonal adornments - hand-crafted wreaths, garlands, and even a gingerbread cottage paying homage to a certain seven diminutive companions. The staff was warm and genuine and they led me to a delightful candlelit table, but I would not be distracted. The food was the Cratchit to my Scrooge, and I was eager to withhold the lump of coal.

Within moments my entrée arrived, a rather surprising display of Sierra Golden Trout with Hot Almond Dried Cranberry Couscous, Smoked Bacon and Lemon Thyme Vinaigrette - hardly the mulled mash I expected. The bold flavors immediately warmed my stomach and, like a visit from a Christmas spirit, melted my icy exterior away. I topped it off with a divine Warm Rocky Road Brownie Sundae, and my chains of despair fell to the floor. I wished my server "happy holidays," flipped coins to nearby children, and even danced with fellow diners to the nostalgic holiday tunes playing above. Before the evening was over, I thanked my chef and promised never to trust my seasonal preconceptions again.

Needless to say, I give Carthay Circle Restaurant my merriest recommendation and suggest a visit right away, before the holiday menu vanishes like a grim future. Carthay Circle Restaurant is located on Buena Vista Street, and it offers an autumn menu, a Thanksgiving dinner on Nov. 22, and three-course Christmas dinners between Dec. 20-26. 


