
"Ah gee," added Mortimer McKenzie, owner of Mortimer's Market, in his trademark high-pitched

I don't do pizza. Don't get it. Don't eat it. And certainly don't review it. In fact, I haven't stepped foot in a pizza parlor since I was an awkward lad visiting my dear aunt Judith one distant summer ago in Long Island. So when my lovely editor insisted I write a piece on an establishment called Boardwalk Pizza & Pasta, well, you could only imagine the depths of my delight.

Inglebert also recommends:

- Ramone's Pear of Dice Soda (Sprite, hint of desert pear, mojito gourmet flavor, and lots of ice) at the Cozy Cone Motel.
- Mango Madness (mangoes, peaches, bananas, and non-fat yogurt blended with orange, pineapple, guava and passion fruit juices) at Schmoozies.
- Pacific Ono Ceviche, Avocado, Tomatillo-Cilantro Essence, and Crisp Plantain Chips at Carthay Circle Restaurant and Lounge.
- Fritto Misto (Calamari, Mussels, Green Beans, and Artichoke Hearts lightly-breaded served with Pepperoncini Aioli) at Alfresco Lounge.
- New York Strip Loin with home-style beef gravy, mashed potatoes, peas and carrots with Mater's Tulsa Tea at Flo's V8 Cafe
- Make reservations at Carthay Circle Restaurant by stopping by or calling 714-781-DINE.

Pizza - so simple, so difficult to mess up, yet everyone seems intent on discovering new ways to do it. Too soggy, too greasy, too sweet, too bland. But if my editor wanted a predictably painful piece on the matter, whom would I be not to indulge.

After the short journey to the quaint, seaside village of Paradise Pier, I entered the family-run establishment. The décor was one of nostalgia and pride, and I found myself momentarily charmed by the tales of the immigrant story documented throughout. But it was the food, I was there for. And I would not be seduced by such meanderings.

I chose a Portobello Mushroom and Spinach Flatbread with herbed marinara, mozzarella, artichokes, pesto, ricotta salata and pecorino romano. While I appreciated the attempts to utilize new and interesting ingredients, it wasn't until that first bite that it happened. Until that first bolt of zesty, savory, chewy, crispy perfection exploded on my taste buds and destroyed all of my misconceptions. Indeed, I had arrived on the other side of the wormhole, and I was my aunt Judith's nephew again. I was on Long Island, and I was young, and I loved pizza.

Before I could thank anyone for the transnational experience, I decided to try an Italian Chef Salad, generously decorated with salami, capocollo, provolone, fresh



mozzarella, pepperoncini, roasted red peppers, marinated olives, cucumbers, tomatoes, crisp lettuce and a red wine vinaigrette. And while its presentation was beautiful, the flawless blend had clearly been crafted over hundreds of years, as the family passed down its traditional recipes. One bite, and I was incapable of being a critic anymore.

And as I strolled outside, taking in the clean seaside air, I wondered seriously whether I was in any jeopardy of losing my career. It was then that I spotted the neighboring restaurant, Paradise Garden Grill. Specializing in Mediterranean skewered meats and vegetables, savory sauces, rice pilaf, and pita, I decided to partake in a bit of baklava to get my bearings back. Because surely, nobody in this part of the world could possibly make a proper baklava. Or so I thought.

I give Boardwalk Pizza & Pasta and Paradise Garden Grill my highest recommendation and suggest a visit right away. Somebody in Paradise Pier knows what they're doing down there.

the Scare Pig. Catch the horrendous, eye-popping act all summer long right there on Hollywood Boulevard!


Or if cerebral scares are more your speed, step inside the cool, comfortable Animation Building and learn to draw Sulley, himself, at "Animation Academy."
